




NEWSLETTER: ISSUE #1



Firstly, we wholeheartedly want to thank our donors for their generous support in our inaugural year in 2013 as a non-profit institution. We raised a good amount of money in a short time and appreciate every single dollar pledged to AMA on behalf of your scholarships for the class of 2013.

Your donations will support at least another 32 scholarships for the class of 2013 (indicatively divided into 22 BA's, 6 MA's, 4 PhD's). Together with 15 existing recipients from the class of 2012, AMA will have supported a total of 47 recipients by the end of the year at the University of Education in Ho Chi Minh City (32 BA's, 9 MA's, 6 PhD's).

We are proud to have friends such as you who believe in us and also in the power of giving. Your kindness motivates not only the students and teachers, but also us at AMA to work harder on your behalf to make a difference in the world.

Our Growing Team:

In the past few months, we have been dedicating more time and energy to building sufficient infrastructure and human resources to support our growing efforts. Our goal is to focus on quality over quantity at this initial stage, thus our attention on establishing a solid foundation for the future.

At this point, our team has grown to 8 people. Singapore team is composed of Peter Mach, Claire Ngo, Ashwin Ranganathan, Shirley Kim, and Sophia Woo. Vietnam team has Nguyen Quynh Huong, Tuan Vinh Ho, and Natalie Pham.

We welcome and thank Shirley Kim for giving us her time. Shirley is acting as our internal legal counsel while also helping in other areas.

We are also happy to have Natalie Pham join us in Saigon. Natalie is a veteran educator in Vietnam with a PhD degree in education from the USA. We also plan on hiring a person in Vietnam to give us logistical and administrative support.

AMA is Registered!

AMA Vietnam Ltd is now legally registered as a non-profit organization in Singapore in the form of a company limited by guarantee, which is a legal structure commonly used by NPO's here. Per local regulations, our company will meet financial reporting and auditing requirements annually. We do not have shareholders nor take salaries nor pay dividends to anyone.

We will be considering pro-bono office spaces from kind friends who run businesses in Singapore (and perhaps in Vietnam later). AMA currently has 3 registered Directors and 2 Members in Singapore.



Training Program Successfully Launched!

Apart from offering financial assistance to our recipients, we are also trying to find more ways to deepen our impact on the quality of teaching and the lives of these teachers in Vietnam. Training on effective teaching is critically important and we are fortunate to have Miss Natalie Pham spearhead this effort for us. Natalie has been training teachers for quite some time already in Vietnam, where she also works as a Director of Research and Development at an excellent non-profit high school in Ho Chi Minh City.

In early June, Natalie (see above photo, furthest left) kicked off our training program for the class of 2012 AMA recipients in Saigon. We thank her and her school for giving us the time and the campus facilities for training. It was a big success based on the excellent feedback from our University of Education and the prospective teachers who attended. In fact, the university has asked Natalie to expand the training program on their campus.

The training program ran for 9 days (June 3 to 13th) to cover different areas of effective teaching in Vietnamese for our recipients: (1) Classroom Management: Foundations for a great classroom management, rules and procedures, techniques; (2) Classroom Management: First day of school essentials, record keeping; (3) Multiple Intelligences; (4) Bloom's Taxonomy; (5) Rubrics; (6) Effective Teaching: Criteria 1-2; (7) Effective Teaching: Criteria 3-4; (8) Effective Teaching: Criteria 5-6; Watch demo and evaluate; (9) Learning Centers; Use of Portfolios.
